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Products Needed for Project

- Octi-Hoops
- Pearls & Piping foot by Creative Feet.
- FaBric Stick and Rinse adhesive-backed water soluble stabilizer.
- FaBric Stick and Tear polyester adhesive-backed, tear-away stabilizer.
- Inkjet Printer
- Scissors for fabric and
- 40 wt embroidery thread.
- 90/14 Universal, Stretch or Embroidery Needle.
- 1 yd of pre-strung pearls 2.00mm
- 1 1/2 yd bridal veil Tulle

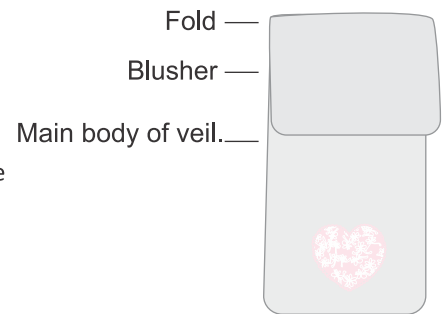

Instructions

- Cut Veil to desired width and length.
- Clare folded her veil 1/3rd of the way from the top, and ironed a crease for gathering. The smaller section is used as a blusher. If you opt to not have a blusher - skip that step and you'll gather along the top edge instead of along crease line.
- Print the heart pattern onto a plain piece of Inkjet paper.
- Apply sticker to veil.
- Apply Stick and Rinse to back of Octi-Hoop frame chosen.
- Apply fabric to Stabilizer.
- Stitch over Sticker as shown on episode.
- Follow the Pearls & Piping foot's instructions for sewing 2.0mm Pearls. Use a wider width - 4.5mm wide for sewing off the edge of your veil. Sew pearls onto edge of veil as Clare showed on the episode.
- Set machine on a straight stitch and increase length to 5.0mm (longest) and thread tension to 9 (tightest) sew a few stitches forward then backward on folded line and then continue sewing to other side. The veil will gather as shown on this It's Sew Easy episode.



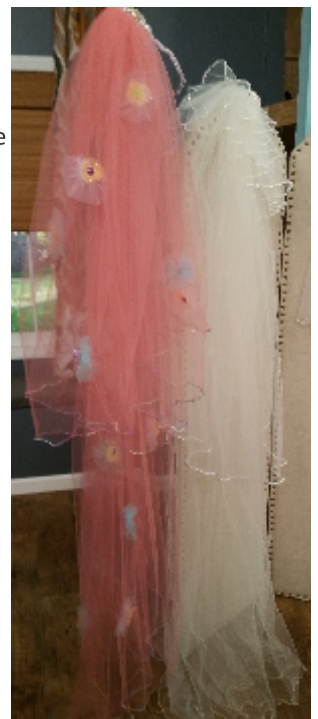

Clare made this veil using the same technique!



1. Print on Inkjet Paper
2. Tape a square of Stick and Rinse stabilizer over heart.
3. Print again.
4. Peel off Sticker
5. Peel off release liner.
6. Adhere sticker of heart on to veil.
7. Once all sewing is complete rinse in warm water until all stabilizer is rinsed away.

You don't have to be perfect!
